

Class Fitting Words: Classical Rhetoric Class Length 70 Minutes

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Class Description: In this course, students will learn the theory of using words well, study the greatest speeches of all time, and practice the skills of effective oratory.

Grades/Ages: This class is designed for students in the 8th-10th grade.

Responsibilities
